Leafmore Brassica + barley

Total growing season rainfall: 117mm



30 Hc '3kg/Ha)- sown 5 September 2016/ resowr 12 Oct

- 21st / ecember, 10 weeks after sowing
- ← a grazed- 500 of the lightest ewe hoggets
- Grazing for 43 days= 75 DSE/Ha stocking pressure/ cell
- June '17- 0.5kg heavier and cut 300 grams more wool- 152kg extra




