Virtual Fence Testing is Go!!



South Australia's first virtual fencing trial of cattle is about to kick off locally.

Virtual fencing is a system, which can control stock movement without having to rely

on physical fences. It has been successfully trialed with cattle in other states but is yet to be tested in SA. However, thanks to funding from the SA Murray-Darling Basin and Adelaide Mount Lofty Ranges NRM Boards, and the Federal Governments Virtual Herding project, CSIRO will conduct a 30-day trial to test its effectiveness to protect environmentally sensitive areas of a commercial grazing paddock at Eden Valley.

In the trial, cattle will be fitted with an Agersens eShepherdTM collar (pictured) that train animals to stay within certain areas of the paddock - in this case stopping access to a waterway and red gum saplings that have regenerated.

The trial is scheduled to start in late May and will be held on the property of Andrew Jaeschkes using their santa gertrudis cattle. In mid June a field day is also planned at the trial site so watch this space for future BIGG communications on that!

BIGG has had a long-standing interest in virtual fencing and sees this project as a valuable opportunity to support its trialing and build producer capacity in its future use.

This project is supported by the SA Murray-Darling Basin NRM Board and the Adelaide and the Mount Lofty Ranges NRM Board (through funding from the NRM levy), the Virtual Herding project (through funding from the Australian Government's Rural R&D for Profit Program) and CSIRO.

BIGG's New Weather Monitoring Station is Up and Running!



Its been a long time coming but BIGG recently had its fourth 'baby'!

In early April a new telemetry monitoring station was installed in a native pasture paddock at Moculta to record soil moisture and climate data. This station complements BIGG's existing stations at Flaxman Valley, Keyneton and Koonunga, which were put up in representative Barossa pasture paddocks way back in September 2013!

The Moculta station is located off Kruschel Rd (between Moculta and Stockwell) on the property of Ian Koch who has extensive native pasture. It includes the same equipment as the other stations, but also an extra sensor measuring wind direction. The station was installed by Peter Toome from TOIP Pty Ltd (pictured with Ian Koch) who is a long-time supporter of BIGG.

Data from BIGGs stations is recorded in near-real time every 15 minutes and can be accessed via the following links:




