Soil Moisture Report-July



Over the last month, local soil moisture levels have remained relatively static, the exception being at Flaxman Valley, which has increased to 68% of capacity (at the end of June, the Flaxman Valley, Keyneton and Koonunga sites were all approximately 50%). In July, Keyneton topped the rainfall figures with 58mm.

Site	July rainfall (mm)	Growing season rainfall (mm)*	Estimated soil water capacity (%)
Flaxman Valley	55	177	68
Keyneton	58	155	46
Koonunga	39	144	54
Moculta	43	129	-

*Rainfall from 1/4/19-31/7/19

The current rainfall totals and soil moisture status can be found on the <u>BIGG</u> <u>website</u> under the '**Quicklinks**' columnn on the right hand side. The sites take reading every 15 minutes and are updated so you can literally watch the rain falling (fingers crossed!).

Soil Moisture Monitoring Case Studies
