# Koonunga Pasture Walk





On September 27 the Koonunga Ag Bureau held their annual crop walk accompanied by Farmer Johns Peter Wendt and Kurtis Ward, and PIRSA's Brian Hughes and David Woodard.

Highlights included Ben Schmidts peaola crop, PIRSA's Koonunga lime trial, BIGG's Koonunga weather station measuring soil moisture, Glen Beckers beans crop, and Farmer Johns pasture trial at Stockwell.

**Soil Moisture Status Update** 



Soil moisture levels are currently quite variable across BIGG's weather station sites. At the end of September, Flaxman Valley is approximately two-thirds full, Koonunga a quarter full, while Keyneton is not far off being exhausted.

Rainfall in September was relatively uniform across all sites, with the highest recording being 41mm at Koonunga.




