**Grass to Dollars Course**

## **Free Soil Test Kits**



Thanks to those who have indicated an interest in a free soil test kit- these will be mailed out to you this week!

There are still plenty of kits available if you would like one!!

The free soil testing program available through the Adelaide Mt Lofty Ranges NRM is continuing through 2019-20 and all landholders in the AMLR NRM region are encouraged to apply. This is available to properties from hobby farms to complete commercial enterprises. Large properties may be eligible for multiple tests to cover different soil types.

The program re-starts each financial year, so landholders who received a test in the 2018-19 financial year are able to use this again this year.

The test is a complete test including all major and trace elements, pH, salinity and carbon levels. Interpretation is by Andy Cole, an independent land management advisor.

We encourage landholders to get their samples in early, as the lab will be very busy over summer. Sample kits are available by contacting <u>Rebecca Tonkin</u> (details below), through the Gawler Natural Resources Centre, or by contacting BIGG's <u>Georgie Keynes</u>.

Please note this offer is only available to properties in the AMLR NRM region.

# Webinar Recording: Summer Feeding Ewes & Ewe Containment Project

The MLA PDS containment ewe project is progressing well with the major and minor sites going through activity plans and in some cases building pens in preparation for ewes to go into containment over the next few months. The project will benchmark results on farm when ewes are contained for a period of time. We will also be looking at feed and any other associated costs with containing ewes versus potential returns and improvements in ground cover and feed on offer when stock are kept off paddocks.



## From the Inbox.....

- Fire Danger Index with crop harvest just around the corner dont forget about harvesting when conditions are safe. To help with this, check out the 'Fire Danger Index' graph calculated from the data for each of BIGG's weather stations (just go to the <u>BIGG homepage</u>, click on your relevant weather station and scroll down to the graph). The graph shows the level of fire risk in near real time and is updated every 15 minutes. Harvest conditions are considered unsafe when the Fire Danger Index is >35.




