Farm Life to Writing a Book...

Fiona Koch's first Novel the Seventh Stele

Moculta farmer, Fiona Koch has recently written her first novel, she shares below how the writing process helped her navigate through a few tough farming years....

I have been fortunate to be involved with agriculture all my life. Growing up on a vineyard and grazing property in the Barossa Valley. I attended Roseworthy College completing a Bachelor of Applied Science in Agriculture and later completing a Graduate Diploma in Agriculture Science from Charles Sturt University. I worked in the wine industry before working on the farm with my husband Ian.

I started writing after Ian and I went to a remote Fijian Island which was popular with back packers. There was no air conditioning, television or telephone. It was quite isolated. After reading all the novels I had in my suitcase and exhausting the small library, I decided to occupy my mind with writing a book I would like to read. So, my first novel began. Writing fiction is a treat because it allows a freedom to invent characters, places and events.

Farm work and life is always busy. It is always full of unexpected events and things not going to plan. Fitting writing in with farm life has been a journey and finding quality writing time a problem. I was determined to finish my first novel and would write when I had the chance. I wrote mostly during drought years. I often woke up at night worrying about the lack of rain so I started writing often about 2-4am in the mornings. Trying to occupy my mind. I was always worrying how the dry would affect our land, livestock and livelihood. Writing provided a form of escapism and it felt more constructive and purposeful working on my novel rather than worrying about something I had no control over such as the weather and lack of rain. (It was very dis heartened watching the bom radar map when rain clouds would disappear just before they reached our farm) Writing became a form of therapy. Challenging times also helped with character development. My characters would also go through challenges and I had to reflect on how they would behave in difficult situations. Writing also helped develop problem solving skills. When you put a character into a bad situation you have to create a plan on how they will escape or survive the situation, which has to be somewhat believable. Working with nature and animals
