BIGG are excited to welcome Dr Christine Jones to the Barossa for a Soil Health and Grazing Workshop!

#### 1st June 2021 Stockwell, followed by two local on farm visits 9.00am- 4pm

Dr Christine Jones is an internationally renowned and highly respected groundcover and soils ecologist. She has a wealth of experience working with innovative landholders to implement regenerative land management practices that enhance biodiversity, increase biological activity, sequester carbon, activate soil nutrient cycles, restore water balance, improve productivity and create new topsoil. Christine has organised and participated in workshops, field days, seminars and conferences throughout Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Western, Northern and Central Europe, Central America, USA and Canada and has a strong publication and presentation record.

This soil health day will include an indoor presentation with Christine Jones, focusing on how we can stimulate and improve our soil health using grazing, unlocking P within the soil, alternative animal health products and improving organic matter in lower rainfall environments.

The afternoon will visit two local grazing properties, one who has been implementing polycultures for nearly 10 years, and one who is just starting out on their journey.

## Two years of feed in three months



Earlier in the month (April 8) BIGG held an Autumn Pasture Walk, with attendees visiting out of season forage crops and also a centre pivot.

First stop of the pasture walk was John Tuesners at Keyneton, where last September John sowed a paddock of forage brassica (Leafmore). Between December-March, approximately 4.0t dry matter/ha was grown, which provided three separate grazings for his ewes and lambs. Even given the cost to establish the brassica, this level of production compares very favourably to feeding out a similar quality feed source such as vetch hay.

Next stop was Rocland Estate at Nuriootpa where wastewater from the winery is being managed with a centre pivot. Winery manager, Ian Craig gave an overview of the pivot and associated water management, which covers a 3.5ha area. In late March, Keyneton farmer, Michael Sagenschnitter sowed a winter wheat crop (DS Bennett), which later in the year he plans to cut for silage and then hay. This is the third year a crop has been sown under the pivot and is a smart way of managing wastewater whilst value adding to local agriculture.

Final stop of the pasture walk was Tracy Bonython's of Bon Chevon at Ebenezer where last November a paddock of forage brassica (Greenland) and millet (Shirohie) was sown. The pasture mix has 'hung in there' but unfortunately hasn't reached its potential given the later than planned sowing date and dry summer.

local grazing systems, including their production potential (two years of feed in three months!) and soil and animal health benefits.

# Containment Ewe Project Update



The BIGG/ MLA ewe containment producer demonstration sites is continuing for the second season. 10 sites have locked up ewes with varying numbers as a lot of producers came into summer with more ground cover than previous years.

Unfortunately the lack of rainfall so far in 2021 has meant ewes are being let out onto full supplementary feed in most cases leading up to lambing. In most sites, containment has gone well this year – however there has been some ewes with lower than required condition scores due to coming in lighter than required, possible worm burdens and competition within pens. Results will be available for sites once

In addition to the producer demonstration sites, this year an honours student; Alex Turner, from Adelaide University, is undertaking a condition scoring project. This project is linked with the Pregnancy Scanning project which is being run by Forbes Brian.

Alex is looking closely at a group of 150 twin bearing merino ewes contained at Keyneton Station to assess individual condition scores over the containment period. This will be linked to individual lambing and weaning results, through DNA parentage, Shepherd collars and pedigree matchmaker and we will be also assessing the effectiveness of these methods of getting accurate parentage. We will also be recording ewe and lamb deaths through autopsy to determine cause of death.

Keep an eye out for an lamb autopsy workshop which will occur in June, depending on how the season is looking!


