



## **Pilates for Farmers**

Every year, the Angaston Agricultural Bureau has a meeting on health and wellbeing, which has proved extremely valuable for some individuals, and as a group, allows its members to support and look out for each other.

On Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> October 2021, an instructional and informative session on "Pilates for Farmers" was led by Kate Shelby James and her team from "Pilates by Kate", Murray Street, Nuriootpa.

Members broke into 2 classes; gentle and intermediate and participated with a lot of commitment and enthusiasm. The gentle session involved exercises utilising a chair and in the standing position, and the intermediate mat session was on the floor with a mixture of basic and challenging movements involving the stretchy band, chi-ball and roller.

All exercises are possible in the home, but Kate outlined how farmers could join her studio for private / duo lessons, or small affinity groups and open classes on both the matt that offers over 70 exercises, and apparatus that affords over 700 activities. In essence Pilates is simple, low stress, low impact movement of the muscles to support the correct alignment of the joints, in-conjunction with mindfulness and is ideal for both preventive and injury rehabilitation.
