2023/24 BIGG Communications Intern – Drought Preparedness

The Barossa Improved Grazing Group Inc (BIGG) seeks expression of interest from students of either agriculture, animal, veterinary science, agribusiness or natural resource management for the 2023/24 BIGG Communications Intern - Drought Preparedness placement. The BIGG Communications Intern will gain training, mentoring and experience by being involved with:

- Reviewing the BIGG Communications Plan with a Communications Consultant / Officer to ensure engagement of local rural producers, rural service providers, local community and youth.
- Updating the BIGG website to convey current learnings.
- Developing and running social media.
- Assisting with event design, management, collate monitoring and evaluation including the BIGG Annual Conference, 8th February 2024.
- Attend appropriate BIGG events and Board meetings, possibly taking minutes and action notes.
- Writing and presenting to appropriate media on productivity / financial, environmental, and human developments in drought preparedness and resilience.

The Intern will:

- Partake in the equivalent of 30 days of internship on a part-time basis within the specified time
 period and by mutual agreement to fit within studies and vacations. As part of the Student
 Internship Program, the intern will receive an honorarium.
- Gain and develop networks, skills, experience and confidence.
- Actively engage with BIGG, SA Drought Hub and other relevant projects.
- Will be workforce ready at the completion of their tenure with a significantly enhanced CV.

Internship period:

Friday, 5th January to Friday, 13th September, 2024.

Location: Work from home, but site office can be arranged if preferred. Ideally can travel to the

Barossa region as required.

Team: The intern will be supported by and under the direction of the BIGG Communications Officer,

with strategic supervision by the BIGG Executive Officer. The intern will be an integral part of

the BIGG team also inclusive of the Technical Facilitators and BIGG Board.


